JUNK Mail: If you do not wish to receive either campus junk mail or junk mail through the post office:

Off campus: Get your name removed from National Mailing Lists by writing to Direct Marketing Association Mail Preference Service P.O. Box 643 Carmel, NY 10512

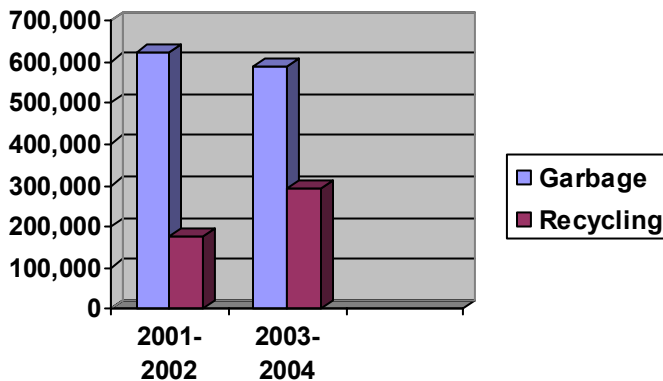
- Include your name, address, the date and a signature.

On campus: Let the mail center know your name and box number.

Why Recycle?

- Leaves, grass clippings, fruit and veggie scraps are turned into compost.
- Paper is sorted and sent to mills nationwide to be turned into office paper, newspaper, and tissue paper.
- Metal recycles into new metal products such as bikes, cans, and aluminum baseball bats.
- Plastic containers can be turned into lumber for decks and furniture or into other plastic products.
- Cardboard recycles into new boxes and paper bags.
- Colored Glass can be recycled into new beer and wine bottles.
- Latex Paint gets cleaned and mixed together, then given away for free to assist in projects to cover graffiti or for painting houses.
- Motor Oil is cleaned and reused in cars or it is burned to create electricity. Batteries are sent to recyclers across the country where metals are separated and turned into new batteries.
- Hazardous Wastes can be disposed of free in Salem by calling 1.800.444.4244

Solid/Recycled waste on Willamette's Campus






The Recycled items include:
