## Capturing power through the lens of art

Salem, Ore. – Drawn from the Hallie Ford Museum of Art at Willamette University's collection of modern and contemporary regional works on paper, "Capturing Power: Works on Paper from the Permanent Collection" presents prints, drawings, and photographs that portray representations of power and power relationships. Organized by curator Jonathan Bucci, the exhibition opens January 7 and continues through April 26, 2020, in the Print Study Center.

The influence of power and its impact on our lives have been imbedded in the content of artistic exploration since the first works of art were created—depictions of the hunt, objects of worship, and representations of gods all relate to power and control. "Capturing Power" asks visitors to consider who is empowered and why, as well as how the works in the exhibition convey a sense of power—be it political, physical, or psychological.


