Last Weeks Results:

Bearcats Finish Season With Pair of Loses

The Willamette University men's basketball team concluded its season with a pair of loses last weekend to Whitworth College and Whitman College. Whitworth, ranked 16th in this week's NCAA Division III National Poll compiled by D3hoops.com, shot 66.7% in the second half (18 of 27) to expand a slim 34-33 halftime lead and claim an 81-66 victory over the Bearcats on Friday, Feb. 16 at the Whitworth Fieldhouse. The following night Willamette lost 81-70 to Whitman to finish the season at 10-15 overall and 6-10 in NWC play.

Against Whitworth, the Bearcats placed four players in double figures, led by junior post Ian Mansfield (Hillsboro, OR/Century HS) with 13 points. Mansfield was 5 of 9 from the field and also supplied five rebounds. Senior Rob Andrus (Wing, Chimacum, WA/Chimacum HS) tallied 12 points, while Kyle McClary (So., Post, Hillsboro, OR/Glencoe HS) and Michael Smith (Jr., Wing, Phoenix, OR/Phoenix HS) each scored 10 points.

Tain Cantrell (So., Post, Beaverton, OR/Westview HS) topped the Bearcats with seven rebounds. Corey Costantino (So., Wing, Ashland, OR/Ashland HS) provided Willamette with seven assists.

On Saturday at Whitman, Smith and Andrus led Willamette with 13 points apiece. Andrus also provided five rebounds, two blocks and two steals. He concluded the season by scoring in double figures in 12 of Willamette's final 14 games.

Simon Currie (So., Wing/Post, Bend OR/Mt. View HS) and Costantino contributed nine points apiece for the Bearcats. Three other Willamette players tacked on eight points each, including Dan Nugent (Fr., Wing/Post, Portland, OR/Jesuit HS), who also blocked three shots to end the year with 39 blocks for the season. Also scoring eight points were McClary and C.J. Stuvland (Sr., Pt. Guard/Wing, Portland, OR/University of Oregon).

Cantrell grabbed six rebounds, as he tied Nugent for the Willamette lead. McClary matched Andrus with five boards, while Currie brought down four rebounds.

Bearcat Notes:

- This year's losing season was just the second losing season in the past six years for the Bearcats. The 2004-2005 team finished that year at 12-14 overall.
- Since the 2001-2002 season, Head Coach Gordie James has guided Willamette to a 91-58 record (61.1 winning percentage)
- Andrus finished the season by reaching double digits in scoring in 12 of Willamette's last 14 games. During those 14 games, Andrus has averaged 12.6 points per game, and shot 50.5% (52 of 103) from the field, including 43.2% (16 of 37) from 3-point range.
- Smith was nominated for NWC Player of the Week after averaging averaging 11.5 points and shooting 44.4% (4 of 9) from 3-point range over the Bearcats' two games last weekend.
- Before this weekend, Nugent had scored in double figures in nine straight games (he was held to eight and six points respectively in the two losses last weekend). He finished the year scoring in double digits in 17 of Willamette's 25 games. He has produced 20 or more points eight times, including a season-high 34 points against the University of Puget Sound on Dec. 1. He is averaging 15.2 points per game for the season, which puts in him in eighth place in the NWC in scoring.

- Saturday's game against Whitman marked the last game in a Bearcats uniform for two seniors, Rob Andrus and C.J. Stuvland. Point guard Josh Erickson (Keizer, OR/McNary HS) was also a senior this season, but he only saw action in two games this year after injuring his right knee early on. The same injury caused Erickson to miss the entire 2004-05 season.
- WU concluded its home schedule with an 8-2 record at Cone Field House. The Bearcats averaged 82.2 points per game at home, while shooting 51.1% from the field and 78.3% at the line. WU's only home losses were to Lewis & Clark and Whitworth, which are the two teams that tied for the conference title this year.
- Willamette finished the season as the Northwest Conference leader in two statistical categories: free throw shooting at 75.9% (423 of 557), and blocked shots per game at 3.6 (90 total). The Bearcats also finished the year second in the NWC in field goal percentage, as they shot 47.6% (663 of 1394) on the season.
- Mansfield finished fourth in the NWC in rebounding with an average of 7.2 boards per game (179 total). He hauled down a season-high 16 rebounds at Puget Sound on Dec. 1.
- In Friday's battle against Whitworth, Willamette led 8-1 early in the game and held a 31-30 advantage following a jumper by Andrus with 1:17 remaining in the half. The Pirates scored the next four points, before Mansfield closed out the first half scoring for Willamette on two free throws with six seconds left to bring WU within a point at 34-33.
- Against Whitman, the Missionaries held a 37-29 lead at the half and extended the margin to as many as 16 points, 58-42, with 10:14 to go. The Bearcats rallied to within four points, 68-64, with 5:51 to go, following a steal and layup by Smith. Smith's basket completed a 22-10 run by Willamette.

Last Week's Results:

Willamette Finishes Season With Win Over Whitman

The Willamette University women's basketball team finished the season on a winning note by defeating Whitman College 47-46 on Saturday, Feb. 17 in Walla Walla, Wash. On Friday night the Bearcats lost 74-57 to Whitworth College. Willamette finishes the season at 5-20 overall and 3-13 in NWC action.

On Friday night against Whitworth, Sara Brooks paced the Bearcats with 17 points. Brooks was 5 of 7 from the field, including 4 for 4 on 3-pointers. She also contributed two steals, two rebounds and one assist. Freshman Keilyn Fujioka (F, Kailua, HI/Iolani HS), playing for the first time since receiving a leg injury in the closing seconds at Lewis & Clark College on Feb. 3, also reached double figures. In 27 minutes off the bench, she tallied 15 points and grabbed five rebounds. Fujioka was 5 of 9 on field goals and 5 of 6 at the line.

Laura Payne (Jr., G, Sammamish, WA/Skyline HS) added nine points, a game-high five assists and four rebounds for the Bearcats, while Tracie Nygaard (Jr., F, Knappa, OR/Knappa HS) provided six points and five rebounds.

Saturday's season-ending win over Whitman stopped an eight-game losing streak for WU. The Bearcats trailed by 10 points at halftime, 28-18, but held Whitman to 22.7% shooting (5 of 22) in the second half. The defensive effort helped Willamette outscored the Missionaries, 29-18, over the final 20 minutes.

An 18-1 run got the Bearcats back in the game, as WU turned a 34-22 deficit at the 14:43 mark into a 40-35 lead with 9:36 remaining. Payne hit four 3-pointers during Willamette's run, which ended with 15 unanswered points. Payne opened the run with a 3-pointer, before Whitman tacked on a free throw. Payne then scored three more 3-pointers during the 15-0 streak.

Despite the big run that put them up, the Bearcats had to overcome a 46-42 deficit with 4:00 remaining to win the game. Rebekah Wells (Jr., G, Lynnwood, WA/Edmonds-Woodway HS) scored the game's final five points, as she put through a 3-pointer with 3:48 left, then added a pair of free throws at the 3:04 mark to give Willamette the lead for good. Neither team scored the rest of the way. Kristina Francis took the game's final shot for Whitman with three seconds left, but failed to score and Victoria Swigart (Jr., G, Newport Beach, CA/Newport Harbor HS) hauled down the rebound to secure the win for the Bearcats.

Payne led Willamette with 14 points and six assists. Fujioka contributed 12 points and a team-high nine rebounds, plus three blocked shots, two steals and an assist. Fujioka was 5 of 7 from the field. Wells added eight points and three boards for the Bearcats.

Bearcat Notes:

- Fujioka returned to action after missing the Bearcats last two games with a knee injury. She was doubtful for the games at Whitworth and Whitman, but the freshman from Hawaii came off the bench during both games and was a major factor.
- Fujioka had an impressive freshman campaign for the Bearcats. She finished the year second in the NWC in field goal percentage, shooting 53.8% (99 of 184), third in the conference in rebounding, with an average of 8.3 boards per game, and fourth in the NWC in blocked shots (1.22 per game, 28 total). In addition, she finished 15th in scoring, with an average of 10.3 points per game.

- Payne led the NWC in minutes played per game (34.44), and also finished fourth in assists per game (2.8), and 20th in points per game (8.9).
- Brooks finished the season third in the NWC in assists per game (3.32), fourth in steals per game (1.63), seventh in 3-point field goals made per game (1.26), and ninth in assist to turnover ratio (1.07)
- The 'Cats win over Whitman was their first NWC road win of the year. Two of Willamette's other four victoris came on the road, but both were non-conference games.
- Fujioka scored in double figures in 12 of the 23 games in which she played, while Payne scored in double digits in 11 of the Bearcats 25 games. In addition, Fujioka reached double digits in rebounds in eight games and was the 'Cats leading rebounder in 17 games this year.
- Fujioka was nominated for NWC Player of the Week for her efforts against Whitworth and Whitman. It was the sixth time this year that she earned the nomination.

Last Weeks Results:

Bearcats Go 1-2 During Trip to Southern California

The Willamette University baseball team went 1-2 over the weekend during their trip to Southern California. The Bearcats dropped a pair of games at Pomona-Pitzer on Saturday, Feb. 17, before rebounding for a 9-6 win over California State University-San Marcos the following day. Pomona-Pitzer defeated WU 9-7 and 11-6. Willamette's record now stands at 2-4 on the year.

In the opener, the Sagehens plated six runs in the bottom of the eighth inning to surge past the Bearcats and into the lead. The comeback stole a win from Willamette starter Tye Sundlee (Jr., RHP, Yakima, WA/West Valley HS), who left the game with a 4-3 lead after allowing just six hits in seven innings. Willamette's lead expanded to 7-3 after the Bearcats tallied three runs in the top of the eighth.

Top hitters for Willamette in the opener were Ellis Webster (So., 2B, Carlsbad, CA/San Dieguito HS), who went 2 for 4 with a run and two RBIs, and Grant Yamaguchi (Sr., 1B, Aiea, HI/Mid Pacific Institute), who achieved two hits and scored three runs in five at bats. Dan Maslanik (So., C, Boulder, CO/Fairview HS) was 1 for 2 and led the Bearcats with three RBIs.

In the second game, Willamette struck first with three runs in the opening stanza. All three runs were earned with two outs, as Kyle Stalker (So., DH/1B, Bellevue, WA/Sammamish HS) and Sean Anderson (Jr., CF, Klamath Falls, OR/Klamath Union HS) both doubled and eventually scored on a home run by Ty Eriksen (Sr., 1B, Vancouver, WA/La Salle HS).

Willamette outhit the Sagehens in the second game, 12-11, but left 10 men on base and struck out 10 times. The Bearcats received three hits in three at bats from Stalker, while Anderson (2 of 5), Eriksen (2 of 5) and Matthew Rasmussen (Sr., SS, Sandy, UT/Bingham HS), who went 2 of 4, each provided more than one hit. Both of Anderson's hits were doubles, while Rasmussen was credited with one double.

Webster, playing less than 30 miles from his hometown, was the offensive star for WU in their win over Cal State-San Marcos. Webster hit a two-run double with one out in the top of the ninth inning to break a 6-6 tie and send the Bearcats on their way to the 9-6 victory.

Webster was the offensive leader for Willamette as he collected three hits in five at bats. He also scored twice, as Willamette rallied from an early 4-0 deficit. The Bearcats went on to hold leads of 5-4 in the sixth and 6-5 in the seventh, before scoring three runs on two hits in the ninth.

Also offensively for WU, Eriksen hit a solo homer, while Anderson and Kelly Gilmore (Sr., RF, Keizer, OR/McNary HS) each went 2-for-4. Also, David Tufo (So., 3B, San Bruno, CA/Burlingame HS) drove in three runs for the Bearcats.

Up Next for the Bearcats:

Willamette Travels To California for Spring Break Action

The Bearcats will return to action on Saturday, Feb. 24 when they play a doubleheader at California State University-East Bay in Hayward, Calif. The first pitch is slated for 11 a.m. (PST). On Sunday, WU plays a single game against East Bay at noon.
