The Port Townsend Marine Science Center, PTMSC, announces openings for three Environmental Educator positions sponsored by the Washington State Americorps program. PTMSC facilities, located in Fort Worden State Park, include a Marine Exhibit of live, near shore animals and plants and a Natural History Exhibit featuring shorelines, past and present, with an emphasis on geology. The PTMSC is an educational and scientific organization devoted to understanding and conserving our marine and shoreline environment. Americorps is part of the Washington Service Corps job-training program. These positions are for a ten and a half month duration starting October 15, 2007.

DUTIES

All three positions will:

- Serve on the PTMSC education team, leading school programs in the exhibits, labs & in the field.
- Work with the public, leading interpretive programs & informal tours.
- Develop education curriculum for school groups and the general public.
- Coordinate training programs for staff and volunteers.
- Work with & train volunteers to assist in the care of animals and exhibits.
- Maintain the Marine and Natural History Exhibits, keeping exhibits and tanks clean.
- Work in our gift shop.

ASSIGNMENT

In addition to sharing the above duties, each Environmental Educator will be assigned an additional area of responsibility:

- Marine Environmental Educator: Responsible for the care and heath of the animals in the marine exhibit. Will develop an exhibit tank design plan and work on maintenance of our saltwater plumbing system. Will oversee an exhibit promoting conservation issue facing residents of and visitors to the Puget Sound region. Will design lessons that involve students in questioning real world environmental issues to improve science literacy among K-12 students and meet Washington State science education requirements.
- Discovery Lab Environmental Educator: Responsible for supervising
 experiments, analyzing samples, processing data and overseeing events in the lab.
 Will promote the Discovery Lab for citizen science and environmental monitoring
 studies by establishing partnerships with other groups working on base line
 monitoring. Will build community capacity for citizen involvement in monitoring and
 providing community educational outreach about Puget Sound marine topics of concern.
- Natural History Environmental Educator: Responsible for the collections, exhibits
 and events in the Natural History Exhibit. Will help coordinate a continuing
 education winter speaker series. Will develop winter programs for K-12 students that
 meets Washington State science education requirements and focuses on Puget Sound
 topics of concern. Will work closely with our Education Specialist to book and plan
 classes, review curriculum and lead education programs.
