"Sourcing Black Gold: Obsidian and its Role in Interpreting the Archaeological Past"

Thursday, Apr 4, 2024 | 7:30 PM - 9:00 PM | WU Truman Wesley Collins Legal Center Room 201 John C. Paulus Lecture Hall | 245 Winter ST SE, Salem

This presentation is about obsidian, a volcanic glass used for the manufacture of stone tools, and how archaeologists study this unique raw material to better understand past human behavior. Special emphasis is placed on provenance studies, whereby obsidian artifacts can be traced from their point of discard to their geological origins. While provenance studies are relatively simple in that they reveal where artifacts originate, the implications of this premise are far-reaching. To illustrate this point, two case studies are discussed. The first is from the central Mediterranean, where extensive obsidian exchange networks existed among early farming communities of the Neolithic while the second concerns the earliest hunter-gatherer populations of the U.S. Great Basin.
