Objectives and Process

The purpose of your service-learning project is to connect what we do in the classroom with the "real" world. Service-learning projects provide an opportunity to help you develop a more complex understanding of our topics in class, as well as a deeper sense of their relevance.

Each student will choose one service-learning project to complete before the end of the semester. If possible, a group opportunity will be provided. There is no absolute rule regarding number of hours, but the project should be substantial enough to merit reflection on our course themes. Many projects will fall between three and six hours of time; others may be on-going or of a more significant or permanent nature. Please check with me if you are in any doubt as to whether what you have chosen will work for this assignment.

A reflection paper of 5-7 pages single-spaced is due on the last day of class. Your task in the paper is to connect our course content with your experience in a meaningful way.
