NEW DIRECTIONS IN EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP (NDEL)
ADMINISTRATIVE LICENSE COURSES

Our next Initial Administrative License program will begin in July 6, 2009 (must be admitted to the 2009/2010 cohort – Applications for the 09/10 cohort are best submitted by Feb 2, 2009). The summer courses are for 5 weeks in July and August, all day M-Th most weeks. The September – May courses are held on most Monday evenings from 5-9pm and at least one full Saturday a month. **To apply or learn more, see the contact info on the last page of this flier.**

The Continuing Administrative License Program course for this term is below. The continuing license program consists of 26 non-cohort credits, and participants may take classes in the order and at the speed they wish. Discussion of district-level budget processes, including revenue forecasting, financial accountability, technical and political skills necessary for budget development, alternative budgeting techniques, and local budget law.
