Royal Inca Empire in Peru: Cuzco to Machu Picchu - Pritam Rohila

Located at the height of 7,710 feet, deep in the Peruvian Andes, Machu Picchu is perhaps the most important archaeological site on the South American continent. It was a fortified royal retreat along the extensive Inca foot highway, lost to the outside world until its discovery by Hiram Bingham in 1911. Flying from Lima in a small plane between mountain peaks and over narrow valleys; experiencing altitude sickness at Cusco; and waiting for clearance of the landslide blocking the train track to Machu Picchu; getting there for us was an adventure. But encountering picturesque stepped agricultural terraces of Machu Picchu, along with its stone dwellings, its Temple of the Sun, and Hitching Post of the Sun, made it all very worthwhile.

Chachalu Is Now Open

The <u>Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde</u> announced recently that the <u>Chachalu Museum</u> is now open to the public.

The 2022 Winter Paralympics will feature approximately 564 athletes competing across six sports (78 total medal events). Here are just a few of the U.S. stars to watch by sport. In Alpine Skiing, **Laurie Stephens**

(Wenham, MA) is the second most decorated winter sport athlete on the team with seven Paralympic medals in alpine skiing: two golds, two silvers and three bronzes. Two-time Paralympic medalist **Andrew Kurka** (Palmer, AK) also returns to competition. Kurka became the first Alaskan



Paralympic medalist when he won a gold medal in downhill and a silver medal in super-G in 2018. Five-time Paralympian and 10-time Paralympic medalist **Oksana Masters** (Louisville, KY)—the most decorated athlete on the U.S. roster—returns to compete in cross-country skiing and biathlon. For Masters, it's been just six months since she competed at the Summer Paralympics in Tokyo, taking home road cycling gold medals in time trial and road race. ...continue reading...

City of Salem: My Neighborhood

Strong communities are built on strong neighborhoods where people work and live together. Neighborhood partnerships bring businesses and residents together to create a more livable community with activities designed to meet the unique character of the neighborhood. Neighborhood associations provide a voice for you to participate in government decisions.

Salem's neighborhood associations give you a voice in your local neighborhood and the city as a whole. Although Salem neighborhood associations are recognized by and receive staff support from the City, they are self-directed. Each association sets its own agenda and determines its own course of action. Neighborhood associations have legal standing in all land use matters within their boundaries and are asked by the City and other jurisdictions to comment on a variety of matters important to the community.

Neighborhood association volunteers make a difference by:

- Providing information to decision makers
- Working on neighborhood projects
- Promoting the livability of the neighborhood
- Acting as a communication link between the City and other citizens

The City assists neighborhood associations with their goals through the help of Neighborhood Services staff.
