Men are encouraged to:


- Make a commitment to have a health checkup

Who were Lord and Schryver? Elizabeth Lord and Edith Schryver were landscape architects who designed over 200 gardens in the Northwest. They were the first professionally-trained female landscape architects to own and operate their own business (1929 - 1969) on the West Coast. The Lord & Schryver Conservancy owns Gaiety Hollow, the historic home and garden of Lord & Schryver on Mission Street in Salem. The house and garden are on the National Register of Historic Places. The Lord & Schryver Conservancy also maintains the historic gardens at Deepwood Museum & Gardens, also designed by Lord and Schryver.

Climate Action Committee Formed to Assess Next Steps Forward

A <u>Climate Action Plan Committee</u> (CAP) has been established and will begin monthly meetings on Thursday, May 5, 2022. This Committee will review recommended strategies and guide the next steps for the implementation of <u>Salem's Climate Action Plan</u>. This Plan includes 183 separate strategies for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and increasing community resiliency.

The CAP Committee will meet monthly. The first meeting was on May 5, 2022. The meeting will be held virtually and will be recorded. A livestream feed of this and future meetings will be accessible from the City's Public Meetings YouTube Channel. Salem's CAP is a long-term guide to reducing Salem's greenhouse gas emissions and strengthening the community's ability to respond to climate change-related hazards. The need for this plan was first identified in Salem's 2017 Strategic Plan, and it has been designed to address two Council-set goals for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and becoming carbon neutral in Salem.
