Public Works services impact all Salem residents by building and maintaining streets and sidewalks, providing clean drinking water, maintaining parks and recreation activities, planning and engineering services, treating our wastewater, and protecting the environment. To recognize the community, we are hosting our annual family-friendly event.

Indian School Excavation Reveals Thousands of Artifacts!

Archaeologists, students and volunteers uncovered more than 3,500 artifacts during an April excavation of sites connected with the former Oregon Indian Mission Manual Labor School and the school's administration building (later known as the parsonage).

A Preserving Oregon grant awarded to Willamette University from Oregon Heritage is partially funding this project.

The sites are on the grounds of the Willamette Heritage Center (1313 Mill St. SE) and Willamette University (900 State St.). This year's dig focused on the Mill Street site. Curation of the artifacts is still under way.

Project questions center on:

- Pre-contact Native American settlement and use of the area.
- Early Euro-American settlement of Salem and operation of the Methodist Mission. ...continue reading...

Zachary Stocks, <u>Oregon Black Pioneers</u>, tells the story of how Salem's Asahel Bush and his weekly newspaper, Oregon Statesman, influenced the state's adoption of Black exclusionary laws.

This presentation was titled "The Statesman and The Freedman" hosted by the Salem Art Association on May 15, 2022 at Bush Barn Art Center, surrounded by the <u>Black Matter exhibition</u>. Oregon Marine Reserves: There's More Beneath the Surface

The spirit of exploration is alive and well in Oregon. Only now, it's underwater. Oregon's five marine reserve sites are areas in the ocean dedicated to conservation and scientific research. In the reserves all ocean development and removal of marine life is prohibited. Management and scientific monitoring of the sites is overseen by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife.



5 Sites: Learn about what a marine reserve is,

where they are, and why we have marine reserves. We invite you to explore the <u>Cape Falcon</u>, <u>Cascade Head</u>, <u>Otter Rock</u>, <u>Cape Perpetua</u>, and <u>Redfish</u> <u>Rocks</u> sites and discover what lies beneath the surface.

PBS Video: Secrets of the Surface: The Mathematical Vision of Maryam Mirzakhani

Examine the life and mathematical work of Maryam Mirzakhani, an Iranian immigrant to the United States who became a superstar in her field. In 2014, prior to her untimely death at the age of 40, she became both the first woman and the first Iranian to be awarded the Fields Medal, the most prestigious award in mathematics, often equated in stature with the Nobel Prize.

Oregon Jewish Museum and Center for Holocaust Education (OJMCHE)

The museum's main gallery features rotating exhibitions of national and international stature. Three core exhibits anchor the museum: Discrimination and Resistance; The Holocaust, An Oregon Perspective; and Oregon Jewish Stories. The museum also features a robust series of virtual public programming including film screenings, lectures, and programs in support of exhibitions. For a state famous for exploration, we've only skimmed the surface of our ocean waters. Join us, as we <u>study</u> these areas and learn how to best maintain Oregon's nearshore ocean resources. There's a lot more of Oregon to explore.

Brain Tip: Learn a skill – Teach a skill

It's fun to explore an interest and learn a new skill. Research encourages this because it also helps strengthen the connections in your brain. Neural connections shrink and retract their dendrites are subject to deterioration as we age, so strengthening them can help delay this decline.



And, it doesn't have to be a major new skill. You can try something simple that you haven't done before – visit a different grocery store, write a limerick, learn a new tune or tune in and listen to a different genre of music. Of course, if you want to tackle a larger skill and learn something you've had on your bucket list, go for it. Just set realistic goals.

If you aren't inspired to learn a new skill, consider teaching a new skill to someone else. Teaching a skill requires you to explain it in terms that will help someone else learn it, to break it down into steps, or to think of the skill from a different perspective. This sharpens your mind and cognitive skills. The interaction also boosts your immunities through the social interaction. And, if you desperately can't find a person interested in what you want to teach – talk it through to your pet or a stuffed animal. They'll appreciate the attention and your brain will, too.
