



Now that you've retired...

A six-month trial of a four-day workweek kicked off in the UK this week, the biggest pilot to take place so far. Organized by the UK-based research group, Autonomy and its partners, analysts will track productivity and employee well-being during the pilot. A similar trial with 38 companies in Canada and the US will participate, as well.

A similar trial conducted in Iceland from 2015 to 2019 found an increase in overall well-being while productivity remained the same; 86% of workers in Iceland are now on or transitioning to a four-day schedule. "Microsoft recently implemented a four-day workweek at a subsidiary in Japan, leading to a 40% productivity increase."
