Englewood Forest Festival

August 13, 2022 | 10:00 AM – 4:00 PM

Englewood Park (1260 19th ST NE, Salem, OR)

After a two-year hiatus due to Covid, the Englewood Forest Festival will roll out once again - a free, family-friendly event with an array of offerings for everyone.



Paradise of Samoa

The Englewood Forest Festival returns for a lively and Polynesian Dance Troupe magical summer day of art, music, dance, fun,

environmental workshops, and a chance to reconnect in a beautiful setting.

Festival offerings: Festival-goers will find 36 art vendors and 29 nonprofits and community service organizations on hand during the day, plus 6 hours of entertainment on two different stages.

The 7-acre Englewood Park is a major highlight of the festival. Developed by the renown Lord & Schryver design team, Salem's oldest park is a historic and hidden gem.

Merriment, music and dance, learning how to make repairs and take care of trees, birds and streams - plus loads of art and environmental activities for all members of the family - are on tap.

Live music and dance performances will take place on two stages and feature the local Ty Curtis Band, the Classical guitar and cello duo of Isaac Engel & Leah Burleson, ENLACE Cross-Cultural Ballet Folklorico Guelaguetza, Paradise of Samoa Polynesian Dance Troupe and Bollywood East Indian dance, among others. Russian concert pianist Asya Gulua, who performs internationally, will play as a benefit for a local Ukrainian refugee family.

Many resources from the Xerces Society, Marion County Master Gardeners, Marion Soil & Water Conservation District, and Audubon Society will be available to show how to attract and support pollinators and birds. People will learn how small changes in yards or even apartment decks can make a difference.

The Brain and Napping

Spain is known for incorporating midday siestas, meaning naps, into residents' daily schedules. But the age-old practice, which dates back to ancient Rome and keeps people resting during the hottest part of the day, could become an important tool around the world as intense heat waves continue throughout Europe and beyond. In addition to keeping you inside when it's warmest, taking a post-lunch nap can help you catch up on sleep lost during hot nights and leave you feeling more refreshed and ready to take on the rest of the day (Fortune, 7.22, Mui).

Scientists have found that people who napped for 30 to 90 minutes had better word recall – which is a sign of good memory – than people who did not nap or who napped for longer than 90 minutes. People who napped for that golden 30 to 90 minutes were also better at figure drawing, another sign of good cognition. (Johns Hopkins)

The ideal siesta length is 15-25 minutes. With the exceptionally high heat this summer, try it out.
