ICL Update:

• Board Meeting (September 15th - DRAFT Minutes):

We need volunteers for our November 8th Up Close Session:

Each semester we take a session away from our academic pursuits and focus on personal stories that reflect the wide diversity of paths that have led us to this spot on the planet at Willamette University in Salem Oregon.

One thing that we all have in common at this age is unique stories. Some are funny while others are tragic but in all instances they are always interesting and unique!

This semester we are using the afternoon session on Tuesday November 8 to share stories related to our experience with military service and/or outcomes of our nation's military adventures.

Since this will be the week of <u>Veterans Day</u> - formerly Armistice Day - we will indeed honor our veterans while at the same time sharing life stories of our military related experiences.

In the past few years we have had ICL members tell World War II related stories:

- Growing up in Berlin in the 1930's;
- Born in Hungary, family escaped war to Australia;
- Living in London during the 1944 Nazi Bombing Attacks;
- Working on the radar research that had to be completed, installed, and working by D-Day.

Apparently we are not done with WWII just yet as we have a couple of veterans that we hope to interview as part of this session. The exact format of the session will depend on your stories and whether or not you have pictures to share. We can do a brief interview or have you do a short slide show. Technical assistance is available.


