

- Sibley V2 Has a nice comparison feature. \$19.99
- iBird Pro A great overall app. Subscription based now at \$9.99 a year.
- Audubon Birds A very good app that is free.
- Raptor ID The best raptor app, and it is free
- Merlin Bird ID Has Sound ID and Photo ID capability. It is also free.
