Grant was a Professor Emeritus at Willamette University, a molecular biologist, biology department chair for 14 years, and taught from about 1969 until his retirement in 2008. Roger Hull, retired Willamette professor of Art History died on October 5, 2023. Roger was not an ICL member but gave at least 4 presentations at ICL. Roger was the driving force behind the creation of the Hallie Ford of Art in 1998. In his capacity as a faculty curator at the museum for the past twenty-four years, Roger has helped document the art and artists of Oregon through the numerous exhibitions he has organized and the 12 books and 6 scholarly brochures he has written.

Followup on Dr. Janet Lorenzen's presentation:


