

ICL Update:

 - There were 92 responses to the survey.
 - On a scale of 1 to 10 here's a chart of the responses to the question about the quality of the presentations. **Well done, Curriculum Committee!**

If you did attend, how impressed were you with the quality of the presentations?

88 responses



- Everyone who answered the question about vaccinations has received at least 1 shot. Almost all are fully vaccinated.
- Overwhelmingly (81) people prefer using email for communications within ICL. 9 people said the newsletter.
- About half of the responses (47) were pleased with the balance of the classes between ICL members, WU professors, and outside presenters. 19 wanted more outside presenters and 19 wanted more WU professors.
- Most (44) found the classes well balanced in subject matter; 19 want more Natural Sciences; 16 want more applied science; 11 want more humanities classes; 10 want more social sciences and 10 prefer more of the arts. (Note: People could choose more than 1 response)

The Tidepools are ALIVE!

That time of year is upon us with amazing negative tides. If you are visiting the tidepools, mindfully explore for your safety and also the safety of the many tidepool creatures who call the rocky shore home.

Tips for Visiting a Rocky Intertidal Area

- Tread lightly, travel slowly and carefully.
- Stay on marked trails and stand/walk on bare rock.

There have been rapid changes to COVID mitigation guidelines from the CDC and Oregon Health Authority in recent weeks.

The following guidance, effective immediately, provides clarification for our campus operations and will be in place until you are notified of an official change in Willamette policy, regardless of any guidance that may be communicated by the CDC or OHA.

Masks on campus (applies to vaccinated and unvaccinated community members)

- Outdoors — Masks are not required outdoors on campus as long as people maintain six feet of physical distancing and are not in a large outdoor gathering.
- Indoors — Masks are required indoors unless you are in a private workspace.

Guest and visitor policy

- Outdoor spaces on campus will be open to visitors but buildings will remain closed except to those who are here on official university business and with prior approval.
- Guests and visitors are not required to wear masks outdoors but are required to wear them indoors.



On a PC and a Mac:


- Enter this link in the address bar of your browser (Chrome, Safari, etc.): <https://willametteuniversity.zoom.us/j/92212104940>
- Once there, click on the star at the right end of the address bar in most browsers:




- Rename the link if you'd like. Example: ICL Meetings
