Who are the Hanni Scholars?

Originally called the "**Phil Hanni Student Scholar Award Program**" in honor of ICL member and past Willamette University chaplain (from 1973 until 1985), Phil and Erin Hanni joined ICL in 1997 and gave many presentations and contributed to ICL and the University in many important and memorable ways. Phil served as Curriculum Director from 2000 until 2005. After Phil's death in 2013, ICL decided to honor his many contributions by establishing the student scholar program - while also honoring those outstanding students at Willamette who were so much in Phil and Erin's thoughts.

To this end ICL takes great pleasure in presenting this award each* year since 2014 to the six top upper class student scholars who have applied for the award as judged by a panel of Willamette faculty and ICL members. *Due to Covid-19, awards were not given out in 2021 and 2022. The original \$400 award was increased to \$500 by the ICL board in 2022 (July 21 meeting) and comes out of ICL membership dues. Students learn of this opportunity from posters that are distributed throughout the campus and encouraged to apply by Willamette faculty. There were 8 applications this semester. The 6 winners are selected by an ICL ad hoc committee headed by Tom Zook based on applications submitted electronically.

Mark your calendars! As part of the requirements for receiving a check, winning students are asked to give a presentation at ICL during the Spring semester. Those presentations will be in the afternoons of April 6, 11, and 13th (1pm - 3pm). Students are asked to leave time for Q&A which gives ICL students an opportunity to interact with some of the larger population of students on campus. And it gives the Willamette students a chance to present their work - often related to a senior thesis - to a live audience and answer well informed questions from ICL members about their work. Always educational, interesting, and even hopeful!
