### Willamette University Network Outage:

Willamette is still trying to recover from a "cyber incident" that has disrupted their technology and operations. They are working around the clock to restore the network and systems as securely as possible. Last week we found that our keycards to get into Kaneko are working. Wifi was not working but has been restored on campus. The WUTemp WiFi is being provided from a clean, secure environment within our firewalls. It operates as a guest network, meaning you won't need to use your Willamette credentials to register your device. Simply connect your device to the WUTemp network and enter the password "resilience" (no quotations, all lower case).
