

LLM PROGRAM IN TRANSNATIONAL LAW

Learning Outcomes

Graduates of the LLM Program in Transnational Law will be expected to have mastered the fundamentals of international law and dispute resolution, international business transactions, comparative law, private international law, including conflict of laws, or, for foreign lawyers, the fundamentals of one of the above areas of law along with a basic understanding of United States law. This includes the structure of government and the U.S. court system, sources of law, the litigation process and the fundamentals of legal analysis, research and writing. Each graduate will also be expected to have a practical grasp of their respective emphasis within transnational law. Learning outcomes will vary in content among graduates of the Program, but graduates will be expected to have a firm grasp of the theoretical, policy-oriented, practical, and ethical dimension of international lawyering. It is also expected that graduates of the Program will be able to apply comparative and international legal insights to resolve pertinent domestic law issues.

For selected foreign students, an important learning outcome is to help them prepare to take a state bar exam where available to LLM degree recipients.
