DIVERSITY OF LOSS GRIEF GROUPS to continue in Fall

Sign up for grief groups! The group is called Diversity of Loss: The Journeys of Grief, which focuses on social support for those who are grieving, in a group setting: a chance to digest and understand the raw emotions that come when we are faced with significant yet varied losses. The group is lead by Maegan Brooks, a professor at WU who specializes in grief. She quotes that "the Diversity of Loss grief groups are wonderfully supportive spaces to more deeply understand how loss affects all of our lives. Our groups also explore **how we can** care for ourselves and others in the midst of loss."
