<p>EBT Cards (also known as Food Stamps or SNAP): Students who do not have a meal plan and meet certain criteria are eligible for an EBT Card through the state of Oregon. <p>Subsidized Phone Plans:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Assurance Wireless or SafeLink Wireless ● Lifeline: provides a discount on monthly service of \$9.25 per month for eligible low-income subscribers.
